

## FORGIVING AND OVERLOOKING OFFENSES

Question: Why should we develop the mindset and practice of overlooking offenses and granting forgiveness to others?

Some biblical principles to consider:

- 1) **It is to our g\_\_\_\_\_ to overlook an offense.**

Proverbs 19:11 "A man's wisdom gives him patience; it is to his **glory** to overlook an offense".

- 2) **A p\_\_\_\_\_ p\_\_\_\_\_ overlooks insults.**

Proverbs 12:16 "A fool shows his annoyance at once, but a prudent man overlooks an insult".

Case study: King David - 2 Samuel 16:5-13

- 3) **We should learn to d\_\_\_\_\_ m\_\_\_\_\_ before disputes break out.**

Proverbs 17:14 "... drop matters before a dispute breaks out".

- 4) **A w\_\_\_\_\_ person keeps himself under control.**

Proverbs 29:11 "A fool gives full vent to his anger, but a wise man keeps himself under control".

- 5) **We should f\_\_\_\_\_ whatever grievances we have against each other\***

- 6) **We should forgive as the L\_\_\_\_\_ has forgiven us\***
