"Are You Ready to Meet Your Maker?"

Question: Are you ready to meet your Maker?

Acts 17:31 (all verses NIV): "For He has set a day when **He will judge the world** with **justice** by the man (Jesus) He has appointed. He has given **proof** of this to all men by raising Him (Jesus) from the dead". (See also John 5:28-29)

Every person will be judged by his or her Maker (God the Father and Jesus Christ). The judges are just and the judgments will be righteous (Romans 2:5; Acts 17:31: II Timothy 4:1,8). There are two different final judgments:

- Unbeliever's Judgment ("Great white throne judgment" for people who do not have their name in the Book of Life. Book of life is mentioned in Ex 32:32-33; Ps 69:28; Dan 12:1; Phil 4:3; Rev 3:5, 13:8, 17:8, 20:12-15, 21:27). Described in Revelation 20:11-15.
 Verdict = guilty. Sentence = life sentence, cast into the lake of fire (eternal hell). Degree of punishment will vary, but all will be punished (Mathew 11:20-24; Luke 10:13-14, 12:47-48; Romans 2:6,12; Revelation 20:11-15).
- 2) Believer's Judgment ("Bema seat judgment" for people who have their names in the Book of Life - Rev 21:27). Described in II Corinthians 5:9-10. Verdict = not guilty. Sentence = life sentence, living with Jesus in heaven. Degree of rewards will vary.

I John 2:28 "And now, dear children, continue in Him, so that when He appears we may be **confident** and **unashamed** at His coming".

Hebrews 4:13 "**Nothing** in all creation is **hidden** from God's sight. Everything is uncovered and laid bare before the eyes of Him to whom we **must give account**".

Romans 14:10-12 "...For we will **all stand** before God's judgment seat ... so that each of us **will give account** of himself to God".

Revelation 22:12 "Behold, I am coming soon! My reward is with me, and I will give to everyone **according to what he has done** ...".

II Corinthians 5:9-10 "So we make it our **goal to please Him**, whether we are at home in the body or away from it. For we **must all appear** before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may **receive what is due him** for the things done while in the body, whether good or bad".

Read: I Corinthians 3: 10-15, 4:5

2) The Bible mentions the ability to earn "crowns", "praise", "treasure" and "rewards" (I Cor 9:25; II Tim 4:8; Jam 1:12; I Pet 5:4; Rev 2:10; I Cor 4:5; Mat 5:11-12, 6:19-20; Eph 6:8;

Col 3:23-24; Rev 22:12). Perhaps our greatest r will be to hear "well d , good and f servant!".

Parable of the Talents from Matthew 25:14-30 "... Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness! ...".

There are a number of major motivations that encourage us to serve God. All of these can be useful motivators:

- a) Love unconditional love is the highest and best motivation to serve. But the reality is that we are human and imperfect, so additional motivators are sometimes needed.
- **b)** Appreciation we want to serve God out of appreciation for all He has done for us.
- c) **Obedience/Duty** we may choose to serve because we are told to.
- d) Fear we may serve because we are afraid of the consequences of not serving; or we serve because we are in "awe" of God.

e) Incentives – God knows us well and knows that incentives can be powerful motivators, so He included numerous mentions of incentives in His word.

Biblical Principles:

1) We should make j_____ for ourselves (I Cor 2:15).

2) We should n____judge others, but leave that role for God (Romans 2:1-16, 14:4, 10-13; Mat 7:1-5; Luke 6:37; James 4:11-12).

3) We should e_____ others, and instruct and exhort (I Thes 2:10-12, 4:8, 5:11; Col 2:2; Heb 10:24-25; Rom 15:14; Col 3:16).
